The Development Planner position is responsible for delivering a variety of municipal planning services. You will play a critical role in community engagement, and communication on significant planning issues and projects.

The ideal candidates for these positions will need to be pragmatic, have a collaborative work style, demonstrate a high degree of political acumen, and possess well developed organizational skills and conflict resolution skills to reach successful outcomes on planning issues.

Core Accountabilities:

- Interact on a continuous basis with the public through telephone and written inquiries as may be required to convey planning related information to citizens and other individuals and groups.
- Review, process and manage medium-density residential and non-residential development applications, redesignation, and subdivision files for compliance with Provincial and Municipal policy, regulations, and technical requirements.
- Prepare and presents reports, materials, and opinions as a representative of the Town of Canmore to various bodies, including Council, Canmore Planning Commission, Subdivision and Development Appeal Boards and public groups.
- Maintain professional affiliations and demonstrate a comprehensive current knowledge of applicable legislation, new trends and literature.
- Effectively represent the municipality in public and landowner/applicant meetings.
