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## Senior Mobility Policy Planner - AMENDMENT

As the Senior Mobility Policy Planner, you will be responsible for playing a leading role in developing, implementing and monitoring policies, strategies, design specifications and long-range network plans including those related to driving, active modes, transit, electric and autonomous vehicles, goods movement, adaptive re-use of road space, shared streets, and other uses of public rights-of-way.

You will work with mobility-focused colleagues on the team to integrate and align public space and mobility policies. As a Senior Planner in the City and Regional Planning Business Unit, you will mentor planners on new/updated policies and collaborate with engineers and designers to ensure that new and retrofit investments in mobility infrastructure align with policies and design standards. You will provide technical expertise, systems thinking, and project management skills to City Building projects and pilots, and will liaise directly with the public and industry partners to negotiate solutions to complex problems with competing interests. Primary duties include:

- Develop and revise City of Calgary policies, strategies and design standards to guide decisions on public space and mobility programs, infrastructure investments and facility designs.
- Negotiate with industry partners, collaborate with internal teams to identify gaps and capitalize on opportunities, research best practices, engage with the public & advocates, write policy & strategy documents, present to Council and support colleagues in the implementation of approved policies and strategies.
- Lead project teams and manage projects by coordinating the activities of peers & assigned resources, prepare & present technical reports and maintain project records in alignment with City standards.
- Review Consultants' proposals and manage contracted service providers.
- Manage projects and experiments to evaluate new techniques to create a variety of mobility options for Calgarians and activate under-used public spaces and transportation modes.
- Monitor emerging trends in mobility, how they impact the design & use of mobility networks, and how they are regulated & maintained in other jurisdictions. Work with research institutions and industry to understand trends, their consequences for established practices & standards and update policies & regulations.
- Design, review and maintain key network maps that provide long range planning guidance on where and how the City plans to invest in a variety of mobility facilities.
- Provide subject matter expertise on application of maps to relevant parties. Amend Municipal Development Plan and Calgary Transportation Plan through reports to Council to ensure network plans are supported corporately.
- Monitor mobility behaviour in Calgary and assess the effectiveness of policies, strategies and design standards to achieve targets.

### Qualifications

- A degree in Planning (as recognized by the Canadian Institute of Planners), Transportation Planning, Geography, Public Policy or a related discipline is required.
- At least 8 years of progressively responsible and varied transportation planning experience, including experience with policy and strategy development, design standard development and implementation, and mobility monitoring and reporting is required.
- Experience with multi-modal network analysis, forecast modelling, network planning and design, transit planning, cycling policy and strategy development, street activation programs, or traffic calming policy and implementation are considered an asset.
- A graduate degree or supplemental education in the relevant domains is considered an asset. A relevant designation (RPP, PTP, PMP, RSP) is considered an asset.
